ANTONIA GRIMALDI

Festival Programmer, Giffoni Film Festival, Italy

Antonia Grimaldi is the Festival Programmer for the Giffoni Film Festival. Born in Salerno in 1970, she studied Literature at the University of Florence. She was a member of the Child Jury at Giffoni Film Festival in 1983 and in 1984. From 1987 to 1997 she collaborated with GFF working on catalogues and as assistant to the short film selection. Since 1998 she has been a member of the Artistic Direction of the Giffoni Film Festival and from 2005 to 2019 she has been one of the two deputy directors. Her main activity at the festival is the selection of the short films for all the sections and of feature films dedicated to children from 3 to 12 years of age. Antonia also works on festival educational programs and lectures. Carmela e Aisha, her first play about two women immigrated in Milan in two different period, was published in the miscellaneous volume Confini and staged in 2008. Since 2014 she has been a teacher of Italian, History and Geography in public middle school. In 2016 her novel IL CLUB DEL PIUMINO ROSSO was published by the editor L'Isola dei Ragazzi.

ARJUN BHASIN Costume Designer, India

Arjun Bhasin is an Indian costume designer and stylist, who works both in Hindi cinema as well as Hollywood. He is most noted for his work in Dil Chahta Hai (2001), Rang De Basanti (2006), and has done international films like Monsoon Wedding (2001), The Reluctant Fundamentalist (2012) and Life of Pi (2012). He has also remained the fashion editor of GQ India.





INSHALLAH MONTERO

Filmmaker, Phillipines

Inshallah Montero is an award-winning filmmaker. Her thesis has received the Best Thesis Film at the CINESBI 2012 Film Festival for her film, 'Ang Lalaking Parisukat'. Her thesis film also won at the Manhattan International Film Festival 2013 in New York and was screened at the United Nations. Her film 'Women of the Shore' was screened at the COP21 Climate Change Conference 2015 in Paris and her film 'Women of the Forest' won 2nd best movie award at the Climate and Environment International Film Festival in Myanmar. Her short film 'Papa's Shadows' was the Jury Prize Winner at the Qcinema International Film Festival last 2016 and won Best Camerawork at the 'Int. Children's TV Festival Dytiatko 2017, Ukraine'. The Film Development Council of the Philippines awarded her as one of the Film Ambassadors for 2018. She was also recently included at the Luang Prabang Film Festival Pitching Forum under Tribeca Film Institute last December 2017. She won Best Editing Silver Award at the Adobo Design Awards 2019 for two videos under the Extra Mile Productions



JOHNSON CHENG

Filmmaker, USA

Johnson Cheng is an award-winning Chinese American writer/director hailing from the San Gabriel Valley of Los Angeles County. His films have been official selections at over 100 international film festivals, including Tribeca, AFI FEST, TIFF Kids, Reykjavík (Golden Egg Selection), Giffoni, Short Shorts Tokyo, and Palm Springs (Best Student Film Award). Johnson is a recipient of the HBO APA Visionaries Award, Princess Grace Award (Cary Grant Film Award), and the AT&T InspirASIAN Student Film Award. He is an alumnus of the New York Film Festival Artist Academy. He is also a member of the Motion Picture Editors Guild and holds an M.F.A. in Film Directing/Screenwriting with Honors from Columbia University's Graduate Film program in New York City.

MIKE PANDEY

Wildlife Filmmaker and Founder, Riverbank Studios, India

Mike Pandey is an award winning filmmaker specializing in films about wildlife and the environment. He has won over 300 awards for his work to spread awareness about biodiversity and species conservation, including helping conserve and protect key species such as whale sharks, elephants, tigers, vultures and horseshoe crabs. In 1973, Mike set up Riverbank Studios, a film studio in New Delhi, which focused on creating films about conservation and the wildlife. He has been awarded the Green Oscar for three of his films, The Last Migration - Wild Elephant Capture in Surguja, Shores of Silence: Whale Sharks in India and Vanishing Giants and is also a National Award recipient. He has been a presenter for multiple global platforms such as Animal Planet, Discover Channel, National Geographic, Doordarshan, among others. He also serves as the brand ambassador for eco-tourism and Wildlife and Environment, Heritage and Spiritual tourism for the state of Uttar Pradesh.





NANDITA DAS

Actor, Director, India

Nandita Das has acted in more than 40 feature films in 10 different languages. Her directorial debut in 2008 was Firaaq. She has been twice on the jury of the Cannes Film Festival, among others. She has a master's degree in Social Work and is a strong advocate for social justice and human rights. She was conferred the 'Knight of the Order of Arts and Letters' by the French Covernment. Nandita was the Chairperson of the Children's Film Society and wrote a monthly column for 8 years in the Indian magazine, The Week. Manto, Nandita's second directorial film premiered in 2018 at the Cannes Film Festival and can be watched on Netflix. Her first book 'Manto & 1' chronicles her 6-year long journey of making the film. She wrote, directed, produced and acted in a short film called, Listen to Her, that sheds light on the increase in domestic violence and overburden of work that women have been facing during the lockdown.

NEETA BALI

Director-Principal, GD Geonka World School, Gurgaon, India

Dr Neeta Bali is a seasoned educator with over 34 years of experience, having served in institutions such as Mater Dei School in Delhi as Head of department, English, as Vice- Principal, Apeejay School, Noida, as Principal and Head of School at G D Goenka World School, Head of Kasiga Schoola residential School in Dehradun and as Head of Podar International School, Powai, Mumbai. Currently, she is the Director-Principal, G D Goenka World School, Gurgaon. She has spearheaded partnerships with some leading schools in Scotland – Oban High School and Wasatch Academy-Utah – USA. She has worked intensively with the British Council as a BCSA- British Council School Ambassador in promoting the spirit of international mindedness. Apart from this, she has authored English Language books for Frank Educational Aids and a book of Essays for Madhuban. She is the recipient of 'Jean Lawrie International Grant 'and award conferred on her by IASL in the year 2015 and 'Inspiring Educator's Award' conferred by Rocksport and received from Dr Kiran Bedi as well as 'Exemplary Educator's Award 'by Productivity Council of India in addition to the 'Uttarakhand Rattan Award' 'conferred on her in 2015 by PPSA- Dehradun.





SHALABH UPADHYAY

Founder, Storyteller-In-Chief, NEWJ, India

Shalabh Upadhyay is the founder, CEO, Storyteller-in-Chief at NEWJ. Drawing inspiration from the mantra of "Stories of India, Stories for India, Stories by India", Shalabh's work has carved a unique niche in digital filmmaking and storytelling in India. Under his leadership, NEWJ has grown into one of the country's pioneering hubs of visual storytelling through diversified video content short forms, medium forms, mini-series, docu-series and explainers. In a short-span of two years, NEWJ has produced and distributed over 11,000 stories in seven languages - Hindi, English, Tamil, Bengali, Marathi, Telugu and Kannada. Apart from that, Shalabh steered the growth of dedicated verticals for Politics- NEWJ Rajneeti, Spirituality & Religion- NEWJ Dharohar, Pride of India & Men in Uniform-NEWJ Garv and Entertainment - NEWJ Filmy. At the same time, he has ventured into the production of original and branded films under NEWJ Beanbag and informative and explainer stories through Desified. With his vision, NEWJ has aggregated over 5.5 billion views since inception, reaching an audience of tens of millions across a dozen social media and OTT platforms. As many as 550 video stories produced by the 'NEWJRoom' have recorded over a million views each. He is a Columbia Journalism School Graduate with an extensive career spanning in Journalism and Digital Storytelling in the US and Canada, prior to founding NEWJ. He also served as the former India Lead for NowThis and assumed leadership roles at The Players' Tribune and Buytopia (Canada). At the same time, he remains passionate about politics, policy, tech and data

SIMON ROUBY

Filmmaker and Artist, France

Simon Rouby is a filmmaker and artist. Born in 1980, Simon Rouby learned to paint the hard way, that is to say; with a spray can. He then went on to study Animation at the famed Gobelins school in Paris as well as Calarts in Los Angeles. Adama, his first feature film was nominated for the Cesar and European Film Awards in 2015 and then went on to be projected in over 100 countries around the world, winning over 10 prizes. In 2017, he was awarded a one year fellowship at the French Academy of Villa Medici in Rome where he developed a new body of work using video installation. He will be a resident at Villa Kujoyama in Kyoto in 2021.

Artistic Director, Jio MAMI Mumbai Film Festival and Mumbai Academy of Moving Image (MAMI), India

Journalist, creative director, producer and author, Smriti Kiran has been part of the entertainment industry for the last two decades. Her extensive experience in television programming took shape at multiple networks like NDTV, Star News, Star World, Star Plus, Star Movies and Zee TV. An avid believer in the power of narratives, she wrote the screenplay book of the record-breaking film 3 Idiots and produced the screenplay books of auteur extraordinaire Guru Dutt. Smriti is at present the Artistic Director of the Jio MAMI Mumbai Film Festival, where she is committed to help build the festival into a cutting-edge entity.

SONALI BENDRE

Actor, India

Sonali Bendre is an award winning Indian actor, a television personality and model. Over her career of over 25 years, she has appeared in numerous Hindi, Tamil, Telugu and Marathi films and appeared in various Hindi television programmes.
